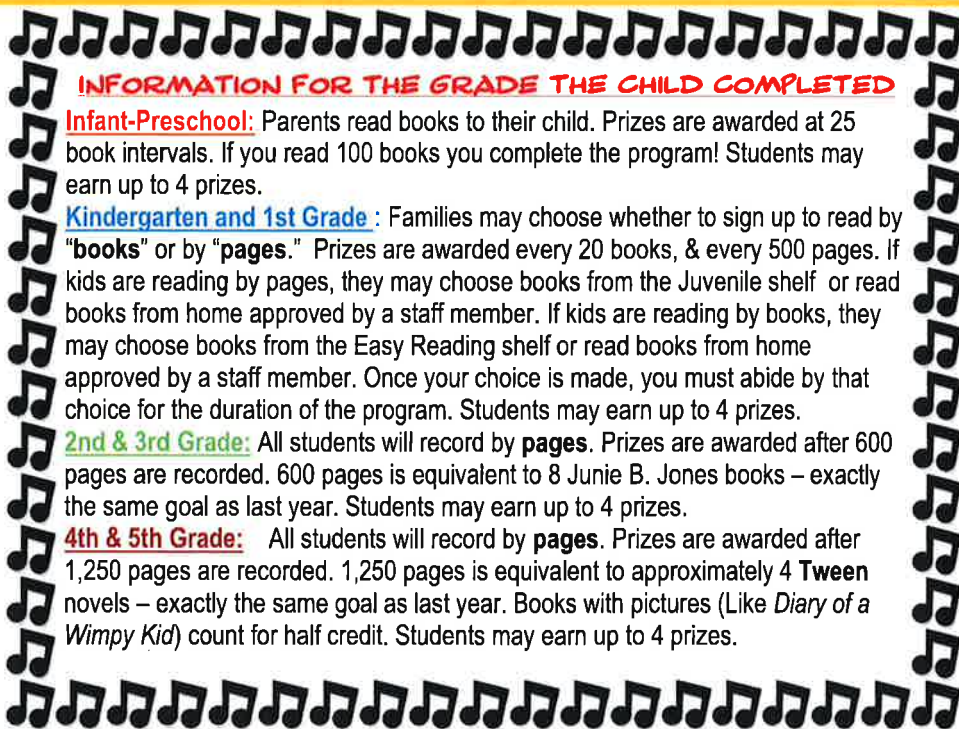

**\*BE SURE TO READ** requirements for each reading program. They are posted in the programs when you sign up & record your books.

**\*Registrants for Summer Discovery Programs must have a PPL library card in good standing. \*Fun prizes will be awarded. All readers may choose from the prize store. Prizes will be awarded upon availability while supplies last.**



### INFORMATION FOR THE GRADE THE CHILD COMPLETED

**Infant-Preschool:** Parents read books to their child. Prizes are awarded at 25 book intervals. If you read 100 books you complete the program! Students may earn up to 4 prizes.

**Kindergarten and 1st Grade:** Families may choose whether to sign up to read by "books" or by "pages." Prizes are awarded every 20 books, & every 500 pages. If kids are reading by pages, they may choose books from the Juvenile shelf or read books from home approved by a staff member. If kids are reading by books, they may choose books from the Easy Reading shelf or read books from home approved by a staff member. Once your choice is made, you must abide by that choice for the duration of the program. Students may earn up to 4 prizes.

**2nd & 3rd Grade:** All students will record by **pages**. Prizes are awarded after 600 pages are recorded. 600 pages is equivalent to 8 Junie B. Jones books – exactly the same goal as last year. Students may earn up to 4 prizes.

**4th & 5th Grade:** All students will record by **pages**. Prizes are awarded after 1,250 pages are recorded. 1,250 pages is equivalent to approximately 4 Tween novels – exactly the same goal as last year. Books with pictures (Like *Diary of a Wimpy Kid*) count for half credit. Students may earn up to 4 prizes.
